WHAT	WHERE TO PLANT	WHAT TO WATCH FOR
Sunflower	Sunny, sheltered soil	Support stems for taller flowers
Marigold	Sunny, fertile soil	Plant around tomato plants to prevent flies
Pansy	Full sun or dappled shade	Deadhead to encourage more blooms
Sweet Pea	Sunny spot, support	Protect from mice

BEANS

Green: Black Valentine. Tasty snap beans, hardy and productive plants, flat pods.

Green: Extra Early Refugee. Buttery taste, fleshy pods of fine quality.

Green: Stringless Green Pod. Fine flavor, entirely stringless, pale green round pods.

Lima: Fordhook. Excellent quality beans, enormous bearer of plump well-filled pods.

Wax: Golden. Fine buttery flavor, golden yellow pods, entirely stringless.

Wax: Wardwell. Delicate waxy yellow, brittle beans, hardy and productive crop.

BEETS

Turnip: Detroit Dark Red Turnip. Sweet, tender, dark red flesh.

Turnip: Edmond's Early Turnip. Earthy, blood-red skin, dark red skin.

Sugar: Klein Wanzieben. Excellent for sugar making, especially for experimenters.

CORN

Field: Leaming. Large ears, deep grains, orange yellow color, very productive.

Field: Mortgage Lifter. Long ears, long grains, great yield.

Pop: White Hulless. Produces smaller, crisper, white kernels.

Sweet: Country Gentleman. Delicious, small kernels, private family use.

Sweet: Nectar. Tasty, easy to grow in cold and wet weather, ideal for table use.

MELON

Water: Augusta Rattlesnake. Crisp, sweet, bright scarlet melon.

Musk: Defender. Oval shape, slightly ribbed rind, yellow flesh.

Musk: Emerald Gem. Thick flesh of a delicate salmon flavor.

Musk: Hoodoo. Fine flavor, orange flesh, productive vines.

Musk: Jenny Lind. Very sweet, light green delicious flesh.

Musk: Rocky Ford. Very juicy, greenish white flesh, medium size oval.

Water: The Watson. Very crisp and delicious flesh, dark glossy green rind.

ONIONS

Red: Large Wethersfield. Strong flavor, moderately fine grain, deep purple flesh.

Red: Southport Red Globe. Globe shape, large, deep red skin, very productive.

White: Mammoth Silver King. Large white Italian variety.

White: Southport White Globe. Perfect globe shape and clear white skin.

Yellow: Prize Taker. Sweet, tender, very productive, long lasting.

Yellow: Southport Yellow Globe. Mild flavor, productive, long lasting.

PEAS

Extra Early: Alaska. Pods well filled with smooth peas of unrivaled quality.

Extra Early: Nott's Excelsior. Large peas, fine flavor, closely packed and robust plants.

Late: Alderman. Splendid flavor, large peas, great clusters.

Late: Champion of England. Rich flavor, grows to heights of 3 or 4 feet.

Late: Telephone. Large delicious peas, good for eating/freezing, require supports.

Medium Early: McLean's Advancer. Excellent flavor, abundant pods.



SQUASH

Summer: Bush Fordhook. Great for baking, frying and pies.

Summer: Mammoth White Bush. White, tender and delicious, superior size.

Winter: Hubbard. Sweet, rich flavor for boiling and baking.

Yellow: Yellow Globe Danvers. Excellent for home use and market, long lasting.

How to Grow

DROP-IN GARDENING CLINICS

Vegetables: Saturdays, 9–10 a.m.
